Chords

Chords are an important part of music. A chord is where two or more notes are played together at the same time. Chords are very useful for accompaniment. Chords are often played on instruments such as the keyboard or guitar. Some notes in chords go really well together, others have clashing notes. This term focuses on chords that sound well together. As we go through year 8, chords will be used in a variety of styles of music. One particular genre of music that uses chords in a certain way is Jazz and Blues.

In the 1600s and 1700s, many Africans were captured and sold as slaves. As they were working on plantations under unpleasant conditions, they sang about their lives to help the time pass more quickly. They used their tools to create a beat. Although slavery was abolished, the music continued and led to using traditional blues instruments such as the harmonica, guitar, banjo, violin, piano, double bass and voice. By 1920s, blues was a very popular style of music. Over the years, this has evolved into various different styles. Jazz became popular in the early 20th century, with its roots attributed to Blues music.

One of the most popular types of blues is the twelve bar blues structure. This can be played in any key, but in C the chord sequence is as follows:
